

**BODY OF J. A. PORTER  
IS LAID TO REST HERE**

**Remains of Former Greensboro Man  
Brought Here From Arkansas for In-  
terment—Burial Yesterday.**

Funeral services over the remains of J. A. Porter, a former resident of Greensboro who died at Health, Ark., on Monday, March 6, were conducted from the residence of L. L. Clegg, at 412 North Cedar street, yesterday afternoon by Dr. S. B. Turrentine, assisted by Rev. Dr. Charles W. Byrd and Rev. Z. E. Barnhardt. The pallbearers were: R. F. Aiken, W. T. Sockwell, Mr Wyrick, A. A. Chandler, Edgar Elwell and John S. Michaux. Interment was made in Greene Hill cemetery.

The deceased was 69 years of age and up until a few years ago was a resident of Greensboro. He served throughout the war between the states as a member of the Confederate forces. For about 20 years he made his home in Greensboro, during which time he and his estimable family made a large number of friends, all of whom learned of his passing with sincere regret.

Surviving are two sisters, Miss Carrie Porter and Miss Vick Porter, of Hillsboro; and seven children: Charles A. Porter, of Macon, Ga.; R. E. Porter, of Constanca, Cuba; Miss Annie G.
